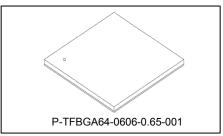

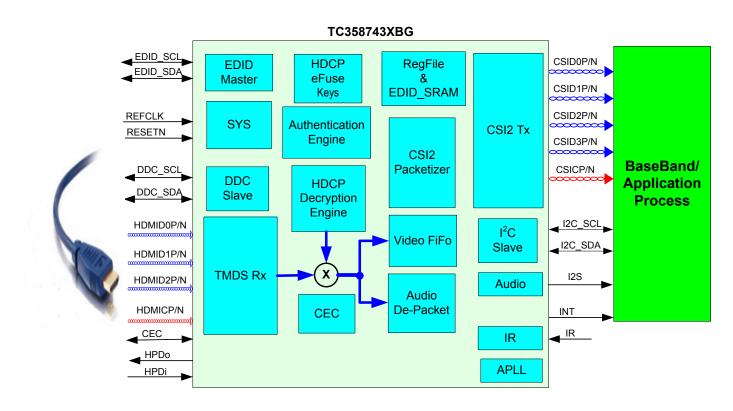


Figure 1.1 TC358743XBG System Overview
